Worth Parish Council Grant.

At the beginning of last year the band received a grant of £500 from Worth Parish Council towards uniforms, a PA system and new rehearsal music stands.

Unfortunately the need for more new band jackets has temporarily diminished, however at over £250.00, each, the grant money would not have gone far.

We have purchased the P.A. system which will make its debut at Horsham Park, a new larger conductor stand and 10 rehearsal stand. This spent all but £18.000 of the grant and the thanks of the Band was reported to the last Worth Parish Council Meeting.

Instrument Officer and more

The committee are pleased to report that they are now confident that all instruments that are band property are accounted for and recorded. Maggie took on the Instrument Officer role at the AGM and it is important that no instruments are removed or changed without her knowledge.

Her role not only holds responsibility for instruments but also **ALL** the band property (except music) including accessories and music stands

The Band own a full set of heavier duty silver stands in bags which should be used at engagements as our banners are designed to fit on these. Most members have already been issued with one of these stands and in due course Maggie will want to know who. Those who do not have one of these stands should let Maggie know. The new rehearsal stands will be filtered in as required
